Join B-PEACE at Mother's Day Walk for Peace

Budget hearings on strategic ministries coming up Episcopalians are invited to join Bishop Alan M. Gates and the B-PEACE for Jorge Campaign again this year in making a public witness against gun violence by walking together in the Mother's Day Walk for Peace on *Sunday, May 13*.

This annual pledge walk is sponsored by the Louis D. Brown Peace Institute and is a fundraiser for the institute's support of families affected by murder and its efforts to create more peaceful communities.

Walkers can start off together at 8 a.m. from Town Field Park (1520 Dorchester Avenue) in Dorchester, or join the walk at the second entry point at 9:45 a.m. at Madison Park High School (75 Malcolm X Boulevard, Roxbury Crossing). The walk concludes with a rally at Boston City Hall Plaza at 11 a.m.

Register by June 20 for Holy Land pilgrimage with Bishop Harris	 Join Bishop Gayle E. Harris and the Rev. Manny Faria for "Encounters in the Holy Land," a mission pilgrimage in Israel and Palestine, Sept. 28-Oct. 10. The mission pilgrimage will combine visits to holy sites with opportunities to learn about active mission in the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem through its school, health- care and peacemaking ministries. The deadline for registering is June 20. The group will meet three times before the trip for orientation and community building. Estimated cost is \$4,100 per person (double occupancy), with all payments due by July 15. The pilgrimage, which Bishop Harris leads annually, is an opportunity for anyone who is interested in experiencing the land of the birth of the Christian faith; who is willing to listen and learn from sisters and brothers in God who live their faith in a different culture and context; and who want to engage in the mission of God beyond their doorstep. Scholarship fund for children of clergy: Children of clergy canonically resident or licensed in the Diocese of Massachusetts (and their widows/widowers) are eligible to apply for scholarship grants. Grants are for undergraduate degree programs for the 2018-2019 academic year. The deadline for submission of applications is Friday, May 11. Application materials are available online, here. The Boston University School of Theology has received a \$1.5-million grant to create an **innovation hub to foster creative** vocational reflection, and it is now accepting applications from congregations interested in participating in its resulting "Creative Callings" project. Up to 20 New England congregations will be accepted to participate in the hub. Participation will involve two full-day gatherings for congregational teams at Boston University and monthly smaller group cluster conversations around shared interests. Participating congregations will be eligible to apply for grant funding at the end of the first year to support innovative ministries that they are developing around vocation. Applications are due by Sunday, July 15. Congregations will be notified by Monday, July 30, with the first hub event scheduled on Thursday, August 23. • The video series "Door of Return: Racial Truth and Reconciliation Pilgrimage to Ghana" is now available for viewing or download <u>here.</u>

The series of three videos was filmed during a pilgrimage led by Presiding Bishop Michael Curry and Episcopal Relief & Development to Ghana, West Africa. A group of 23 pilgrims visited sites critical to understanding the trans-Atlantic slave trade and its legacy. They traced the journey of captured Africans to the coastal "castles" or slave forts of Elmina and Cape Coast, where the captured people were held before being forced onto ships bound for the Americas. The Anglican Church actively blessed these forts and the slave trade for much of its history.

The videos and accompanying discussion guide are designed to open reflection and conversation on the slave trade and its legacy, the church's role in racial injustice, and continued efforts for truthtelling and healing.
