This Ministry Network Showcase aims to shine a light on the variety of service-oriented ministries offered by churches and networks in the diocese; spark connections and kindle activity to start and strengthen networks of collaboration; and share resources for meeting ministry needs and opportunities in congregations and communities.

**Plan to attend a pre-
convention forum in October**

The 233rd Annual Convention of the Diocese of Massachusetts will take place on *Saturday, Nov. 3* at the Cape Cod Resort and Conference Center in Hyannis. Additionally, there will be an optional dinner on *Friday evening, Nov. 2* celebrating the 30th anniversary of Bishop Barbara C. Harris's historic election. Pre-registration will be required, so watch for forthcoming details in subsequent mailings and announcements, and visit www.diomass.org/diocesan-convention-2018 for materials and updates.

The deadline for submission of all convention materials—nomination papers, resolutions, proposed amendments to the diocesan constitution and canons, applications for admission as a parish or mission, required reports from diocesan committees and applications for display space—is **Friday, Sept. 7 by 5 p.m.** to the Office of Convention and Council (see below).

Pre-Diocesan Convention forums in October offer an important opportunity for learning and discussion about the issues and business to come before the convention, including resolutions and the proposed budget. All are welcome; voting members of Convention are especially encouraged to participate. The forums will take place from 7 to 9 p.m. on:

- *Wednesday, Oct. 17* at St. Andrew's Church (3 Maple Street) in Framingham;
- *Thursday, Oct. 18* at Trinity Church (124 River Road) in Topsfield;

- *Wednesday, Oct. 24* at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston.

They also work throughout the year to plan and run diocesan youth events and strive to make the church a nurturing Christian community that encourages the spiritual growth of young people.

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the Diocesan Youth Council having full voice and vote at Diocesan Convention. Leaders are asked to spread the word to young people about the opportunity to join this important council of the church.

- **Faith in Action: Las Fronteras**, a new program for young people in grades 9-12, launches this fall. Based on the success of past mission-focused youth pilgrimages to the borderlands, this new offering—a partnership between the diocesan Office of Youth Ministry and Episcopal City Mission— includes a year of site visits around the diocese to see faith in action. At each site, participants will explore issues of security and hospitality, stranger

and neighbor, privilege and disadvantage, discipleship and servant leadership, all while participating in community service projects across eastern Massachusetts and developing a community of faith and support among themselves.

The program will begin with an organizational meeting in October, and the year will culminate in the group's pilgrimage to the U.S./Mexico borderlands in August 2019.

Reviewed a draft of the 2019 proposed diocesan budget and heard an update from the committee reviewing Strategic Ministry funding requests.

Heard a report from mission hub program director Jin Min Lee and voted to approve the budgets for the North Shore Mission Hub and the Boston-Cambridge Mission Hub as recommended by the Mission Hub Implementation Committee.

Heard a report from diocesan chancellor Ned Notis-McConarty on the legal and canonical implications of a diocesan group becoming a separate 501(c)3 organization.

Voted to affirm, in principle, the Boston-Cambridge Mission Hub's proposed agreement with the Mission Hub Implementation Committee as a step toward becoming a 501(c)3 organization.

Voted to approve the appointment of Natalie Finstad and Karen Hotte to the Jubilee Global Mission Committee for three-year terms.

Received a list of open positions to be filled by election at Diocesan Convention.

Heard that the Executive Committee voted at its June 7 meeting to approve proposed assessment payment plans for St. Anne's Church in North Billerica and Emmanuel Church in Braintree.
