Online registration now open for Diocesan Convention

Plan to attend a preconvention forum in October In the aftermath of last month's natural gas disaster in the Merrimack Valley, all three Episcopal churches and one Episcopal school in the affected communities–Christ Church in Andover, St. Paul's Church in North Andover and Grace Church and Esperanza Academy in Lawrence–reported no property damage and no known personal injuries but several church families in Lawrence and one in Andover with homes damaged by fires. Many are still without gas service and continue to deal with aftereffects.

The bishops have urged all congregations to consider collecting or designating an offering for a diocesan relief response. Contributions, made payable to the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts and marked "Merrimack Valley Disaster Relief," may be sent to the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts, Attn: Lauren Zook, 138 Tremont Street, Boston MA 02111. Contributions can also be made online <u>here</u> (choose "Merrimack Valley Disaster Relief" from the drop-down menu under "How would you like your gift to be used?"). As recovery continues, the bishops, together with local clergy, disaster response contacts and diocesan personnel, will continue to be in conversation about ongoing response.

Congregations invited to join Massachusetts Indaba 2019	 Last year's Diocesan Convention adopted a mission strategy implementation plan that includes "developing opportunities for teams from congregations to visit other congregations, sharing worship and learning about one another." Since then, a Diocesan Council working group has studied and recommended Indaba—a model for purposeful conversation, arising out of the southern African context, which has been used throughout the Anglican Communion—as a format for addressing the diocesan goal. All worshiping communities in the diocese are invited and encouraged to participate in Massachusetts Indaba 2019: Each interested congregation or community will designate a four-person Indaba team. All participating Indaba teams will attend a kick-off gathering on <i>Saturday, Jan. 12, 2019.</i> Each Indaba team will be assigned to partner with two teams from other deaneries. Three weekends (Saturday morning through Sunday afternoon) in 2019 have been chosen for Indaba Encounters at which each of the three Indaba partner teams will host the other two partner teams, including overnight accommodations in members' homes. The process will conclude with a gathering of all the Indaba teams to share their experiences and hopes for the future. <i>Friday, Nov. 30, 2018</i>, is the deadline for congregations to register for Massachusetts Indaba 2019.
