Register by Jan. 21 for annual Ministry Discernment Conference

Online registration is open through Jan. 21, here, for the annual Ministry Discernment Conference offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry, to be held on Saturday, Feb. 2, 8:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m., at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston. (The snow date is Feb. 9; check www.diomass.org for announcement.) The conference gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts and to explore whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry.

Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2019 is required to attend the conference, along with his or her sponsoring priest and at least one member of the Parish Discernment Committee. Discernment committees, one member of which must be a member of the vestry, are appointed by the sponsoring priest and should be named before the conference so that as many members as wish to may attend. Inquirers are also encouraged to bring their spouses or partners to the conference. FOR INFORMATION: The Rev. NOTES:

- A new task force is forming to examine successful models of engagement with adults in their 20s and 30s, both within and beyond the Diocese of Massachusetts. The group will likely explore successful parish-based, regional and diocesan-based strategies, as well as conduct focus groups with young adults. The group is tasked with reporting its findings and recommendations to the annual Diocesan Convention in November 2019. Life Together is a 10-month fellowship program based in Boston and surrounding areas, focused on cultivating the next generation of prayerful and prophetic leaders, through spiritual practice, social justice, leadership training and community building. CHURCHWIDE:

• In July, the Episcopal Church's General Convention considered 26 resolutions and one memorial addressing issues related to sexual harassment, exploitation and abuse. One of these resolutions, <u>D034</u>, suspends for three years the canon that places a time limit on initiating proceedings in cases of clergy sexual misconduct against adults. There is no time limit on reporting clergy sexual misconduct against children and youth under age 21.

As a result of this resolution, **from Jan. 1, 2019, until Dec. 31, 2021, those who wish to bring a case of sexual misconduct against a member of the clergy will be able to do so, regardless of how long ago the alleged misconduct occurred.** Allegations of misconduct can be made to the intake officer in the diocese where the alleged misconduct occurred, or, if the allegation is against a bishop, to the <u>Office of Pastoral Development</u>. the 2018 General Convention will be working on other ways of addressing these issues, including a process to help the church engage in truth telling, confession and reconciliation.

In the Diocese of Massachusetts, a recently formed task force has begun work toward additional regional education and a storysharing process. More information will be available soon.

• Online filing of the 2018 Parochial Report begins on Jan. 4. The Episcopal Church Center is no longer mailing paper forms to congregations. The diocesan Treasurer's Office, however, will be sending a mailing to congregations that contains the log-in information they need to file their Parochial Report forms online.

The Parochial Report form, as well as instructions and workbooks for each page, are available online <u>here</u>.

The 2018 Parochial Report initial filing deadline is *March 1*, 2019, with a final deadline of *May 1*, 2019.

DIOCESAN COUNCIL ACTIONS:

At its Dec. 6 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Heard that incorrect 2019 assessment figures were sent to congregations in June 2018, resulting in a discrepancy between those figures and the correct figures published in the budget that was approved by Diocesan Convention in November 2018. Thirty-one congregations were affected, with an impact on the 2019 budget of \$68,465.

Voted to adjust the published 2019 assessments so that no congregation's assessment will exceed a 10 percent increase over the 2018 assessment (for a single year only); and that the funds required to cover these adjustments be taken from assessment adjustment reserves not already committed and from budget line item CC4099.

Voted that St. Andrew's Church in Ayer be granted an abatement for its 2017 assessment in the amount of its current arrearage for that year.

Voted that the total assessment arrearage from 2013 owed by St. Peter's Church in Dartmouth be forgiven.

Received a report from the diocesan Treasurer's Office on third-quarter financials.

Debriefed about the November Diocesan Convention.

Heard an update from the Strategic Ministry Committee.

Heard a report that the Executive Committee approved clergy housing allowances for the regional canons at its Nov. 29, 2018, meeting.

Heard an update from the Indaba Working Group.
