The 234th annual Diocesan Convention will be a one-day event on *Saturday, Nov. 2*, with the business portions of the convention to be held at the Back Bay Events Center (180 Berkeley Street) in Boston and the convention Eucharist to be celebrated at nearby Emmanuel Church (15 Newbury Street). The theme for this year's convention will be "The Way of Love," carrying forward the message that Presiding Bishop Michael B. Curry proclaimed during his April visitation in the Diocese of Massachusetts. Hotel room blocks with discounted rates will be available for those who wish to stay in Boston on Friday night.

Preliminary convention information will be sent electronically on *Thursday, June 27* to all clergy and delegates. Clergy and delegates whose e-mail address has changed since their congregation's 2019 annual meeting should e-mail their updated contact information by *Monday, June 24* to Chelsea Smith at [csmith@diomass.org](mailto:csmith@diomass.org).

- The Episcopal Church’s Task Force on Church Planting and Congregational Redevelopment has announced that its first set of **grants for new Episcopal communities** is now available for Episcopal dioceses and mission developers who are envisioning, planning or growing new worshiping communities and missional enterprises throughout the church. The grants are part of a \$2.5-million initiative funded by the 2018 General Convention that seeks to celebrate and strategically support emerging Episcopal Church communities and that builds partnerships within and beyond the church, expands the church’s language of ministry and creates new ways for the church to engage the people of God. Four categories of grants are available. *Monday, July 15* is the deadline for the first round of grant applications; after that, applications will be accepted on a rolling basis through the end of the current ministry triennium in 2021.
