Bishop Curry to speak at MLK Day Breakfast in Boston

Register by Jan. 20 for annual Ministry Discernment Conference

"Transforming Evangelism" launches online book group series Presiding Bishop Michael B. Curry will be the keynote speaker at this year's Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Breakfast in Boston, which is marking its 50th anniversary. The breakfast takes place on *Monday, Jan. 20, 7:30 a.m.*, at the Boston Convention and Exhibition Center (415 Summer Street). This annual event was founded by St. Cyprian's Episcopal Church and Union United Methodist Church. Net proceeds support those churches' community programs and services. All are welcome. Online registration is open <u>here</u> until Jan. 20 for the annual Ministry Discernment Conference offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry. The conference takes place on *Saturday*, *Feb. 1, 8:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m.*, at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston. (The snow date is Feb. 8. Please check <u>www.diomass.org</u> for announcement.)

The conference provides an in-depth look at the 2020 Ministry Discernment Handbook, and gives potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts and to explore whether their call is to ordained or committed lay ministry.

Those considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2020 are required to attend the conference, along with their sponsoring priest and at least one member of their parish discernment committee. Inquirers are also encouraged to bring their spouses or partners to the conference.

• **Cathedral Corps:** Part of the core ministry of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston is hosting diocesan events like ordinations, confirmations and special programs. To exercise this role well, the cathedral needs a reliable corps of people who have a call to hospitality and enjoy large events. Dean Amy McCreath is now recruiting such people from congregations around the diocese for a "Cathedral Corps." Members will be oriented to space and safety procedures and trained to serve as greeters, vergers, crucifers or subdeacons at diocesan events. • A new website, <u>www.EpiscopalCommonPrayer.org</u>, provides Episcopalians with **opportunities to participate in the liturgical revision** called for by <u>Resolution A068</u> of the 2018 General Convention. The site is available in English and Spanish.

Developed by the Task Force on Liturgical and Prayer Book Revision, the website includes draft documents that outline plans and principles to guide work on new liturgical texts. It also serves as a clearinghouse of all liturgies already approved for use by General Convention. The website includes a submission page designed to collect feedback on the draft documents, ideas for liturgical revision and liturgies that have been developed by dioceses and local congregations.

Before its next meeting in April, members of the task force request that bishops, liturgical officers and diocesan liturgical commissions study both the draft documents it has produced and the provisions of Resolution 2018-A068 and respond via the website.

At its Dec. 5, 2019, meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Welcomed new Diocesan Council members: The Rev. Maggie Arnold (South Shore Deanery), Michael Bent (North Shore Deanery) and the Rev. Cheryl Minor (Alewife Deanery).

Voted to direct the treasurer and the Budget Committee to review the bishops' compensation and to report back to Council with a proposal for the 2021 diocesan budget.

Voted to withdraw up to \$900,000 from invested funds for the renovation of the St. Mark's rectory in Dorchester and the stabilization of St. Luke's Chapel at St. John St. James Church in Roxbury. The withdrawal is to be replaced with the proceeds of the sale of 40 Prescott Street in Brookline. This vote is contingent on the authorization of the sale of the 40 Prescott Street property by the Standing Committee and Bishop Gates.

Voted to approve a clergy housing allowance for the remainder of 2019 and future years unless otherwise provided.

Received a report from the diocesan Treasurer's Office on thirdquarter financials.

Voted to approve the transfer of the remaining mission strategy funds of \$15,000 from the 2019 diocesan budget (budget line CC4112) to a new micro-grant fund.

Voted to approve the Roxbury Dorchester "Power in Community" Mission Hub budget for Sept. 1, 2019, to Aug. 31, 2020.

Heard a report from the Diocesan Council working group on communications.

Heard an update about diocesan staff changes.
