# Transitional deacons to be ordained June 5

Diocese celebrates role of deacons on "Diaconate Sunday" June 13

The annual Diocesan Convention will take place Friday-Saturday, Nov. 12-13. If COVID-19 metrics allow for an in-person gathering, the convention will be held at the DoubleTree Hotel in Danvers.

Highlights will include Friday afternoon and evening programs open to all, with Saturday business sessions developed primarily for voting members. Watch for a June 22 e-mail announcing guest speakers and more details. Everyone is invited to mark their calendars and spread the word.

In 2021, a total of \$15,000 is set aside for individual grants from \$500 to \$2,000. 	Voted to approve the creation of a diocesan Nominating Committee for proactive identification and recruitment of leaders for various diocesan leadership bodies.
	Voted that the formula for 2022 assessments revert to the income- based formula presented to Diocesan Council on March 18, 2021, with an aggregate assessment request of \$5,148,299 (a nearly flat year-over-year request), with tiers ranging from 0.5% to 14.5%, and that any assessment abatement or adjustment due to a review of Line A income on a parish's 2019 Parochial Report or due to other unforeseen circumstances be offset by the availability of alternative resources.
	Voted to approve an allocation of \$150,000 from the anticipated sale of 40 Prescott Street in Brookline for phase one property developement at 5-7 St. Luke's Road, Allston.
