(The snow date is Feb. 13. Please check www.diomass.org for announcement.) The conference is offered by the bishops and the Commission on Ministry and provides an in-depth look at the 2016 Ministry Discernment Handbook, giving potential inquirers an opportunity to learn about the ordination process in the Diocese of Massachusetts and to explore whether their call is to ordained ministry or committed lay ministry.</li> <li>Any person considering applying for admission to the ordination process in 2016 is required to attend the conference, along with his or her sponsoring priest and at least one member of the Parish Discernment Committee. Discernment committees, one member of which must be a member of the vestry, are appointed by the sponsoring priest and should be named before the conference so that as many members as wish to may attend.
