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Mission Strategy Drafting Team begins work

The Mission Strategy Drafting Team has begun its work in discerning a draft of a new mission strategy for the diocese that reflects God's call for the diocese's work in the world. The team's draft will respond to the findings in the revised report that was issued in early May by the listening team that gathered input from the diocesan community over the past several months. The drafting team's work will also be informed by demographic and other data and material relevant to the diocese and wider Episcopal Church, as well as previous iterations of diocesan mission strategies.

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The team has expressed its gratitude to everyone who participated in the listening process, which provided perspectives from many different voices from around the diocese, as well as to the listening team that spent many hours in lifting up those voices.

Working with the bishops, the team now at work will develop a draft of the new mission strategy by early August, in time to invite feedback from the diocesan community before the Diocesan Council approves the proposed mission strategy that will be presented at Diocesan Convention in November for final approval.

During this intensive process, the drafting team asks for everyone's prayers for guidance in bringing forth this statement of how the Diocese of Massachusetts will be directed and apply its resources in coming years.

Herself a former Life Together fellow, Bogdan has been serving as Life Together's director of operations and external partnerships since May of 2015. She begins in her new role as executive director on June 1.

• The Youth Leadership Academy (YLA) Camp is July 24-29 at the Barbara C. Harris Camp and Conference Center in Greenfield, N.H. This special week at the camp is the official launch of a year-long program designed for young leaders entering ninth or 10th grade in the fall. The camp experience offers leadership development and faith formation, plus all that summer camp has to offer. It suggests that conversations on public policy issues, candidate forums, voter registration and issue education campaigns, engagement with young adults who are eligible to vote for the first time, get-out-the-vote campaigns and advocacy for voting rights legislation are particularly appropriate activities. DIOCESAN COUNCIL ACTIONS:

At its April 28 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Heard a mission strategy update and voted to accept the nomination of Win Treese as co-chair of the Mission Strategy Drafting Team.

Voted that the assessment formula for 2017 is: assessment due = 15.5% * BASE - \$6,000 (subject to a floor of 0) where the BASE for 2017 is equal to line 14 ("all other operating expenses") from the 2014 parochial report, less line 7 ("assistance from diocese").

For a mission, the 2017 assessment is two-thirds the amount that would be assessed if the congregation were a parish.

Voted to authorize the Assessment Coordinating Committee to consider and receive requests from congregations for adjustments to the 2017 scheduled assessments, with total adjustments not to exceed \$75,000.

Heard a report from the diocesan treasurer, Lisa Garcia, on reviewing the assessment formula for 2018 and beyond.

Heard a report from the chief business officer, Gerry Sullivan, on the year-to-date financials.

Heard an update about Grace Chapel in Brockton.

At its May 19 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Welcomed a new member, the Rev. Phil LaBelle, who is filling the term of the Rev. Julie Carson.

Heard an update from the Mission Strategy Drafting Team.

Heard a recommendation from the Mission Hub Ad Hoc Committee on how to review mission hub program and budgets going forward.

Heard a report from the Treasurer's Office on the 2017 budget draft.

Heard that the Executive Committee approved proposed adjustments to Bishop Gayle E. Harris's mortgage, based on current market values.

Voted to appoint Rob Kelleher to the Assessment Coordinating Committee, joining Connie Melahoures, the Rev. Tom Mousin and Chris Trahan who were appointed by the Executive Committee.
