August forums set for feedback on mission strategy draft

Mission strategy comes before Diocesan Convention for final approval The Mission Strategy Drafting Team is currently creating a draft of a new mission strategy for the Diocese of Massachusetts. The team meets weekly across the diocese, prays together and works to forge important aspects of the diocese's shared mission. The team is taking input and data from the listening events held earlier this year, the bishops, demographic studies, Diocesan Council and other helpful sources as it discerns the Spirit's call for the next steps together as Episcopalians in eastern Massachusetts.

The draft mission strategy will be available in early August. After the draft's release, the team will hold multiple forums around the diocese allowing time to imagine how this mission strategy might shape and give life to the diocesan community in the years ahead. Areas in the draft needing strengthening or retooling may be adjusted after these forums as the team readies a proposed mission strategy for the annual Diocesan Convention in November.

- *Monday, Aug. 15, 7-8:30 p.m.* at Grace Church (385 Essex Street) in Salem;
- *Tuesday, Aug. 16, 7-8:30 p.m.* at St. Mary's Church (3055 Main Street) in Barnstable;
- *Tuesday, Aug. 16, 7-8:30 p.m.* at All Saints' Church (121 North Main Street) in Attleboro;
- Wednesday, Aug. 17, 7-8:30 p.m. at Christ Church (12 Quincy Avenue) in Quincy; and
- *Sunday, Aug. 21, 3-4:30 p.m.* at St. Andrew's Church (7 Faulkner Street) in Ayer.

The 231st annual Diocesan Convention will take place *Friday*-*Saturday*, *Nov.* 4-5 at the Holiday Inn in Mansfield. Preliminary materials were sent to delegates and clergy on June 30 and also are posted at <u>www.diomass.org/diocesan-convention-2016</u>.

All resolutions, nominations for diocesan elections, proposed constitutional and canonical amendments and committee reports are due in the Office of Convention and Council by *Friday*, *Sept. 9 at 5 p.m.* (please note deadline date correction). No late nominations or resolutions will be accepted after this deadline.

Pre-convention forums in October will offer an important opportunity for learning and discussion about the issues and business to come before the convention, including resolutions and the proposed budget. Forums are scheduled to take place from 7 to 9 p.m. on:

Holy Land travel-and-learn opportunity: Scholarship assistance is available to clergy and lay leaders in the diocese who would like to participate in a new course at St. George's College in Jerusalem: "Living Stones: Peace, Reconciliation and the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem," offered Oct. 14-23. The course aims to provide an in-depth overview of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem set within the larger context of indigenous Christianity in the Holy Land. Course participants will engage with members and leaders in local parishes and make visits to holy sites and to diocesan educational and health care facilities in Israel and Palestine. Matching grants provide needs-based scholarships of up to \$2,000 to cover most in-country costs (course fees, room, meals, transportation, drivers and translators). Participants will be responsible for travel and other related costs. Those from small churches and those with little experience in global mission are especially encouraged to apply.
