Join B-PEACE witness at Mother's Day Walk for Peace

Holy Tuesday service and luncheon with bishops As part of the 2018 diocesan budgeting process and the mission strategy review of gifts, resources and programs, the Budget Committee has scheduled three hearings for representatives from strategic ministries to make their presentations and budget requests. All are welcome to attend. The hearings will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. on: Wednesday, May 10 at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston; Monday, May 15 at Emmanuel Church (5 Bryant Street) in Wakefield; and Tuesday, May 16 at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul.

Scheduling of one or more open hearings on all aspects of the diocesan budget is pending.

ECF strategic planning intro offered April 29

Sign-up deadline approaches for Holy Land mission pilgrimage

Paddlers & pilgrims invited to join summer CT River journey RSVP by April 10 to join the Episcopal Church Foundation strategic planning workshop on Saturday, April 29, 9:15 a.m.-3:15 p.m., at the Church of the Advent (30 Brimmer Street) in Boston (please note the change of location). Diocesan congregational development staff and the Episcopal Church Foundation hope to launch a pilot program that focuses on an alternative way of thinking about strategic planning. The idea is that as parishes plan strategically, they need to be flexible and have the ability to change course quickly in response to changing circumstances. The hope is to gather several parish teams who are looking to challenge their congregations. By working together with the consultant, it would reduce overall costs for the Episcopal Church Foundation's services and encourage congregations with similar sets of issues to support and learn from one another as they do their work. Bishop Gayle E. Harris and the Rev. Debbie Phillips of Grace Church in Salem will lead a diocesan mission pilgrimage in Israel and Palestine, *Nov. 24-Dec. 6*, and they invite others to join them.

The mission pilgrimage will combine visits to holy sites, in Jerusalem, Bethlehem, the Jordan Valley, Nazareth, Galilee, Nablus and Ramallah, with opportunities to learn about active mission in the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem through its school, health-care and peacemaking ministries.

The group will meet three times before the trip for orientation and community building. The sign-up deadline is April 30. Estimated cost is \$4,100 per person (double occupancy), with all payments due by Oct. 1.

	Heard that Bishop Gates has formed and ad hoc committee to work with the South Shore Mission Hub to review its programming and budget, and an ad hoc committee to review the appeal from the Merrimack Valley Mission Hub regarding the recent overall hub budget cuts.
	Voted against a motion that would have authorized the Treasurer's Office to move \$150,000 from the Green Loans fund into the Green Grants fund for 2017.
	Voted to adopt Visions, Inc., guidelines for use in Diocesan Council meetings.
	Heard an update on plans to improve communication between Diocesan Council and the deaneries.
	Voted to approve a clergy housing allowance adjustment for 2017.
	Heard that the Compensation and Benefits Committee will be conducting a salary survey in 2018.
	Heard a report from the diocesan treasurer, Lisa Garcia, which included three proposals for a new assessment formula that would result in a 10 percent decrease in aggregate assessments received in 2018, to be voted on at the April Diocesan Council meeting.
	Heard a report from the co-chairs of the Mission Strategy Implementation Organizing Team, Win Treese and the Rev. Nancy Gossling, which included an update about the process for evaluating strategic ministries for the 2018 budget, and voted to approve said process as presented.
