## New formula for 2018 assessments in place

The Assessment Coordinating Committee is receiving adjustment requests until July 7 via the <u>Convention Office</u>.

## Diocesan Convention preparation is underway

Clergy and delegates: New e-mail address? Let the <u>Convention Office</u> know by June 28 so that your materials will reach you. The diocesan Treasurer's Office distributed 2018 assessment calculations to congregations on June 1 using the new assessment formula adopted by Diocesan Council in April. The new formula is a response to requests from congregations for assessment relief, voiced during the mission strategy listening process, and its goal is to achieve a 10 percent decrease in total assessment income to the 2018 diocesan budget.

The previous formula, in use since 2010, calculated a parish's assessment at 15.5 percent of expenses reported three years prior (the most recent parochial report data available at the time the calculations must be made), minus a \$6,000 deduction.

The new formula for 2018 is progressive. It applies three increasing percentages to expenses: 0.15 percent to the first \$0-\$50,000 of expenses; 14.5 percent to the next \$50,001 to \$500,000; and 15.5 percent to any additional expenses above \$500,000. Mission congregations are assessed at two-thirds the amount that would be assessed if they were parishes.

The Nov. 24-Dec. 6 mission pilgrimage will combine visits to holy sites with opportunities to learn about active mission in the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem through its school, health-care and peacemaking ministries.

The group will meet three times before the trip for orientation and community building.

Estimated cost is \$4,100 per person (double occupancy), with all payments due by Oct. 1.

• Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop Michael Curry and Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America issued a joint statement on May 18 calling for **prayer, advocacy and fasting for hunger awareness** on the 21st of each month through December 2018, at which time the 115th Congress will conclude. The effort targets the 21st day because by that time each month, 90 percent of SNAP (formerly known as food stamps) benefits have been used, causing families to experience the last week of the month as a hungry week. DIOCESAN COUNCIL ACTIONS:	Heard an update from the mission hub program director, Jin Min Lee, on several of the mission hubs and voted to approve the Boston-Cambridge Mission Hub's proposed 18-month budget (valid January 2017 through June 2018) for maximum spending of \$236,168.
	Heard an update from the Mission Strategy Implementation Organizing Team co-chairs, the Rev. Nancy Gossling and Win Treese.
	Heard a report from the diocesan treasurer, Lisa Garcia, on proposed 2018 assessment formulas, and voted a new assessment formula for 2018 as follows: Where BASE for 2018 is equal to line 14 ("all other operating expenses") from the 2015 parochial report, less line 7 ("assistance from diocese"), the following rates shall be applied: 0.15% on expenses from \$0 to \$50,000 14.5% on expenses from \$50,001 to \$500,000 15.5% on expenses over \$500,000 For a mission, the 2018 assessment is two-thirds the amount that would be assessed if the congregation were a parish.
	At its May 18 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

	Heard an update from the Rev. Canon Libby Berman on behalf of the Task Force for Parish Closings and Mergers.
	Heard an update from the Mission Strategy Implementation Organizing Team co-chairs, the Rev. Nancy Gossling and Win Treese.
	Reviewed a draft of the proposed 2018 diocesan budget.
	Voted to authorize the Assessment Coordinating Committee to consider and receive requests from congregations for adjustments to the 2018 scheduled assessments, with total adjustments not to exceed \$67,500.
	Voted to appoint Rob Kelleher, Connie Melahoures, the Rev. Tom Mousin and Lynn Smith to the Assessment Coordinating Committee.
