All resolutions, nominations for diocesan elections, proposed constitutional and canonical amendments and committee reports are due in the Office of Convention and Council by *Friday*, *Sept.* 8 at 5 p.m.

Positions to be filled by election at this year's convention include: secretary and treasurer of the diocese; alternate deputies to the 2018 General Convention; alternate deputies to Provincial Synod; members of Standing Committee, the Diocesan Disciplinary Board, the Cathedral Chapter and the Board of Directors of the Barbara C. Harris Camp and Conference Center, and a member of the Trustees of Donations. Find the position descriptions here and the nomination form here.

Pre-convention forums in October will offer an important opportunity for learning and discussion about the issues and business to come before the convention, including resolutions and the proposed budget. All are welcome; clergy and convention delegates are especially encouraged to participate. Forums are scheduled to take place from 7 to 9 p.m. on:

CHURCHWIDE:

- The Episcopal Church Advisory Council for the Stewardship of Creation is accepting applications for the latest round of grants for local faith-based projects for mitigating climate change and safeguarding the integrity of creation. Recommendations for grants up to \$10,000 will be made to the Episcopal Church's Executive Council for its October 2017 meeting, with final grant decisions to be announced in November and funds released in December. - Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop Michael Curry and Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America issued a joint statement on May 18 calling for **prayer, advocacy and fasting for hunger awareness** on the 21st of each month through December 2018, at which time the 115th Congress will conclude. The effort targets the 21st day because by that time each month, 90 percent of SNAP (formerly known as food stamps) benefits have been used, causing families to experience the last week of the month as a hungry week. DIOCESAN COUNCIL ACTIONS:

At its June 15 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Voted a letter of gratitude be sent to Win Treese, who is stepping down as co-chair of the Mission Strategy Implementation Organizing Team.

Heard a mission strategy update from consultant Kristin Hendler.

Heard a report from the mission hub program director, Jin Min Lee, on several of the hubs, and voted approval of the following hub budgets:

Plymouth, Cape and Islands Mission Hub for 2017, maximum spending of \$70,292.28.

North Shore Mission Hub for 2017, maximum spending of \$222,195.

Metrowest Mission Hub for 2017-2018, maximum spending of \$156,571.

Merrimack Valley Mission Hub, allocation of \$70,000, with \$55,000 of that amount to be allocated from the proceeds of unspent funds from the South Shore Mission Hub and \$15,000 granted from the Sears Fund, with the request that the hub reexamine its budget to find possibilities for reduced spending in order to complete its program year.

Heard possibilities for other uses of the remaining unspent funds from the South Shore Mission Hub.

Voted that the Executive Committee at its next meeting will review and vote on the budget for the South Coast Mission Hub.

Voted to accept the audit of the 2016 financial statements of the diocese.

Reviewed an updated version of the proposed 2018 diocesan budget.

Voted to allocate 25 percent of assessment revenue from the 2018 operating budget to strategic ministries.

Voted to authorize the withdrawal of up to \$150,000 from the agency funds of the diocese for severance and outplacement assistance for diocesan staff in 2018.

Reviewed the positions to be filled by election at this year's Diocesan Convention.
