The Director will help to develop and bring to light the musical gifts of our community and be committed to enriching the spiritual lives of others through our liturgy as we worship God together, including by leading our thriving and excellent adult choir. This partner will bring a clear joy and love of music and worship in community to the planning and execution of our Sunday liturgy and other musical endeavors. Finally, a successful candidate will have an open creative mind as we live into our ancient traditions in today's world.

While we are seeking someone with all the requisite skills: musicianship, liturgical knowledge, and organ proficiency, we are looking for someone that fosters and builds community. Musical leadership that is rooted in the care and fellowship of the participants should be a primary value. We also see our Organist and Director of Music as a contributing member of our church family, to be cared for and loved by the community.

Duties and Responsibilities.

- Lead music for worship at Sunday Eucharist at 10:00am weekly
- Promote an environment of spiritual growth and development
- Plan music in conjunction with the Rector and Parish Administrator
- Rehearse with adult choir during the program year (once per week)
- Schedule coverage for vacations or planned absence as needed
- Arrange and schedule maintenance and repairs on all instruments
- Participate in staff meetings and development
- Maintenance of music library and robes
- Work with occasional other vocalists and instrumentalists in addition to regular choir

• Services on occasion outside regular Sunday schedule, such as Christmas Eve, Holy Week, Ash Wednesday, and other major feast days.

Requirements and Qualifications

• Experience and skilled as church organist and choir director

• Knowledge of liturgy and worship in The Episcopal Church (desired, training available as needed)

• Passion to lead others in worship through music and ability to incorporate faith in leadership of choir and others

• Ability to work collaboratively, creatively, and flexibly with others

Compensation and Benefits

- This is a salaried part-time position, 15-20 hours per week
- Six weeks paid vacation and/or professional development per year with five Sundays off
- Competitive salary and benefits as needed
- Right of first refusal for weddings and funerals, which are compensated separately
