

Note: The image on the cover is taken from a mosaic in Germany's Aachen Cathedral. It is the "Pelican in her Piety," a classic medieval image of Christ symbolized as a mother pelican. Tradition held that pelicans "nurse" their young by piercing their breasts to feed them with their own blood, inspiring a symbol both eucharistic and maternal in nature. THE ACCLAMATION AND COLLECT FOR PURITY

The people standing, the Bishop appointed says

Presiding Bishop Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.

Presiding Bishop Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse

the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you,

and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord.

THE PRESENTATION

The bishops and people sit. Representatives of the diocese, both Priests and Lay Persons, standing before the Presiding Bishop, present the Bishop-elect, saying

Michael, Bishop in the Church of God, the clergy and people of the Diocese of Massachusetts, trusting in the guidance of the Holy Spirit, have chosen Julia Elizabeth Whitworth to be a bishop and chief pastor. We therefore ask you to lay your hands upon her and in the power of the Holy Spirit to consecrate her a bishop in the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

THE OATH OF CONFORMITY

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I, Julia Elizabeth Whitworth, chosen Bishop of the Church in Massachusetts, solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Episcopal Church.

SIGNING AND WITNESSING THE DECLARATION

The Bishop-elect then signs the above Declaration in the sight of all present. The witnesses add their signatures. Please stand as you are able. The Presiding Bishop then says the following, and asks the response of the people.

THE PEOPLE OF GOD'S CONSENT

Presiding Bishop Brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, you have heard testimony given that Julia Elizabeth

Whitworth has been duly and lawfully elected to be a bishop of the Church of God to serve in the Diocese of Massachusetts. You have been assured of her suitability and that the Church has approved her for this sacred responsibility. Nevertheless, if any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it now be made known.

If no objection is made, the Presiding Bishop continues




The Presiding Bishop then says







THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

The First Reading Isaiah 49:1-7

Lector A Reading from the Book of Isaiah.

Listen to me, O coastlands, pay attention, you peoples from far away! The Lord called me before I was born, while I was in my mother's womb he named me. He made my mouth like a sharp sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow, in his quiver he hid me away. And he said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." But I said, "I have labored in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the Lord, and my reward with my God." And now the Lord says, who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, and that Israel might be gathered to him, for I am honored in the sight of the Lord, and my God has become my strength-- he says, "It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." Thus says the Lord, the Redeemer of Israel and his Holy One, to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nations, the slave of rulers, "Kings shall see and stand up, princes, and they shall prostrate themselves, because of the Lord, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you.".

The Second Reading Romans 10:8b-17

Lector A Reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans.

The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" But not all have obeyed the good news; for Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?" So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ.

Lector Lectura de la carta de Pablo a los romanos.

Como dice la Escritura: «¡Qué hermosa es la llegada de los que traen buenas noticias!» Pero no todos han aceptado el evangelio. Es como dice Isaías: «Señor, ¿quién ha creído al oír nuestro mensaje?» Así pues, la fe nace al oír el mensaje, y el mensaje viene de la palabra de Cristo.

The Holy Gospel John 4: 21-26, 28-29, 39a

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord

Jesus Christ according to St. John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said to the Samaritan woman, "Believe me, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Judeans. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Christ). "When he comes, he will proclaim all things to us." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking to you." Then the woman left her water jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, "Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?" Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope. Your joy will be to follow him who came, not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of bishop?

with them the sacraments of our redemption?

Bishop-elect I will, in the name of Christ, the Shepherd and Bishop of our souls.

Bishop Will you guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church?

Bishop-elect I will, for the love of God.

Bishop Will you share with your fellow bishops in the government of the whole Church; will you sustain your fellow

presbyters and take counsel with them; will you guide and strengthen the deacons and all others who minister in

the Church?

Bishop-elect I will, by the grace given me.

Bishop Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and strangers, and defend those who

have no helper?

Bishop-elect I will, for the sake of Christ Jesus.

Please stand as you are able.

Presiding Bishop Julia, through these promises you have committed yourself to God, to serve his Church in the office of

bishop. We therefore call upon you, chosen to be a guardian of the Church's faith, to lead us in

confessing that faith.



The Presiding Bishop and other bishops now lay their hands upon the head of the Bishop-elect, and say together

Therefore, Father, make Julia a bishop in your Church. Pour out upon her the power of your princely Spirit, whom you bestowed upon your beloved Son Jesus Christ, with whom he endowed the apostles, and by whom your Church is built up in every place, to the glory and unceasing praise of your Name.

The Presiding Bishop continues

To you, O Father, all hearts are open; fill, we pray, the heart of this your servant whom you have chosen to be a bishop in your Church, with such love of you and of all the people, that she may feed and tend the flock of Christ, and exercise without reproach the high priesthood to which you have called her, serving before you day and night in the ministry of reconciliation, declaring pardon in your Name, offering the holy gifts, and wisely overseeing the life and work of the Church. In all things may she present before you the acceptable offering of a pure, and gentle, and holy life; through Jesus Christ your Son, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and power and glory in the Church, now and for ever.

The Gifts

The new Bishop is presented with a **red stole and matching chasuble, cope and mitre**, which are gifts of the Diocese of Indianapolis. The vestments were designed and fabricated by the Reverend Tom Honderich Designs of Indianapolis, Indiana.

The **pectoral cross** is a gift of the Diocese of Massachusetts. It was created by artist and jewelry designer Sherry Bender.

The **episcopal ring** is a gift of the Diocese of Massachusetts and is a traditional ring engraved with the Seal of the Diocese.

A **crozier** is the ceremonial staff that bishops carry, symbolizing their role as shepherds to the community. The curved top represents their duty to guide, protect, and care for the flock. The giving of this traveling crozier carries special significance, as it once was used by the Right Reverend Barbara C. Harris, the first female bishop in the Anglican Communion. Bishop Harris was a trailblazer, known for her bold advocacy for social justice and her deep commitment to inclusivity in the Church. Passing on her crozier to Bishop Whitworth honors both the continuity of episcopal leadership and the legacy of those who break barriers for the sake of the Gospel.

The **rochet and chimere** are gifts of the Union of Black Episcopalians.

The **white and gold vestments** are a gift of Trinity Episcopal Church in Indianapolis. Kate Howe gave the mitre; Bob and Cindy Wood, the chasuble; Joel M. Harrison, the stole; Eric Hembre, the Deacon's stole; Jeffrey Brinkmann and Michael Schaeffer, the cope. The vestments were designed and fabricated by Patrick Boylan of Grace Liturgical Vestments in Poughkeepsie, New York.

The Reverend Canon Constance C. Coles' multicolor festival vestments are a gift of the Coles McKeown Family in memory of the Reverend Canon Constance C. Coles. CCCC, as she was often known, was ordained in 1979 and later served as Canon for Ministry in the Diocese of New York, guiding scores of priests and deacons through their vocational discernment processes, including Bishop Whitworth.

The **icon** is a gift of the Women Clergy of Diomass.

The **white stole** is a gift of the Diocesan Altar Guild.

The **Tippet** and its **Seal** are gifts of the Bishop of Massachusetts, the Right Reverend Alan M. Gates.

The **gold, red and ivory mitre** is a gift of the parents and husband of the Bishop-elect. It was designed and fabricated by Patrick Boylan of Grace Liturgical Vestments, Poughkeepsie, New York to coordinate with her priestly ordination chasuble.

The diocesan crozier is presented as a symbol of the office of the Bishop of Massachusetts.

The **Bible** is a gift of the Presiding Bishop, the Most Reverend Michael B. Curry.
