## Presiding Bishop Curry to make Massachusetts visit April 26-29

Bishops issue pastoral on suspended time limit for initiating clergy misconduct cases

New priest to be ordained

Registration is open for annual Clergy Conference, April 29-May 1 Presiding Bishop Michael B. Curry has scheduled a visitation in the Diocese of Massachusetts, *Friday-Monday, April 26-29*. Plans for how the weekend will take shape are in the works, with an intention to have at least one public gathering with Bishop Curry in addition to gatherings with other groups in the diocese and time with the clergy at the start of the Clergy Conference in Brewster on *Monday, April 29 beginning at 10 a.m.* More information will be available soon; in the meantime, clergy, congregations and the wider diocesan community are invited to keep the visitation dates in mind as planning for this exciting opportunity continues.

Bishop Alan M. Gates and Bishop Gayle E. Harris issued a pastoral letter on Jan. 17 to the people of the diocese regarding the General Convention's three-year suspension of the Episcopal Church canon that places a time limit on initiating proceedings in cases of clergy sexual misconduct against adults. From Jan. 1, 2019, until Dec. 31, 2021, those who wish to bring a case of sexual misconduct against a member of the clergy will be able to do so, regardless of how long ago the alleged misconduct occurred.

The bishops' pastoral letter is to be published in each congregation of the diocese by *Sunday*, *Feb. 17*. It is available on the diocesan website <u>here</u>.

In the Diocese of Massachusetts, a recently formed task force has begun work toward additional education and a story-sharing process. More information will be available soon.
