D.C. advocacy initiative open to New England Episcopalians	Registration is still open for "Love God, Love Neighbor: Advocacy in Action"—a two-day initiative in Washington, D.C., <i>Wednesday-</i> <i>Thursday, Dec. 4-5</i> , focused on gaining refugee protections. The Diocese of Massachusetts, in partnership with sister New England dioceses, Episcopal Migration Ministries and the Office of Govern- ment Relations, is organizing the event. The goal is to have two people from each of New England's 21 congressional districts travel to Washington, D.C., for a day of advocacy training that will pre- pare them for meetings with their senators and representatives the following day. • One focus of the regional canons' work is to support diocesan clergy in efforts to preserve and deepen their wellness. To begin, the regional canons have put together a **short survey** to help them understand what forms of **clergy support groups and other supportive offerings** are already happening in the diocesan community. • The **Task Force to Respond to the Opioid Epidemic**, created by action of the 79th General Convention, is seeking input from lay and ordained leaders throughout the church about local response. The short **online survey** is available in English <u>here</u>, in Spanish <u>here</u> and in French <u>here</u>.

<u>Resolution 2018-C037</u> calls on all dioceses and congregations to respond to the opioid epidemic with training, pastoral care, advocacy and liturgy. Central to this response are partnerships with local responders and others in the medical community, other faith communities and local recovery programs to offer pastoral care to those affected by the epidemic, and with other faith leaders to advocate with local and state government regarding policies and laws to promote healing and wholeness.

Information collected through the survey will help the task force shape its work as it curates and creates resources for churchbased opioid response ministry for use by churches, organizations and communities. Task force resource materials will be posted <u>here</u> in the coming months.

Voted to approve a resolution advising notification from the diocesan treasurer during the first week of November to congregations whose 2018 Parochial Report has not been filed with the diocesan Treasurer's Office, to include the offering of assistance with Parochial Report preparation, and notice that congregations that fail to submit 2018 Parochial Reports to the diocesan Treasurer's Office by Jan. 31, 2020, will have their assessment calculated using the most recent Parochial Report that has been completed, plus 20 percent, and will not be considered for adjustment by the Assessment Coordinating Committee.
