Preliminary Diocesan Convention details announced

Nominations and resolutions due by Sept. 10.

Visit <u>www.diomass.org/</u> <u>diocesan-convention-2021</u> for information and updates. This year's annual Diocesan Convention takes place *Friday-Saturday*, *Nov. 12-13*, under the theme "Members One of Another" taken from Romans 12:5 and an invitation to celebrate and explore our interdependence as members of the Body of Christ.

Friday's sessions will be virtual and open to all, with the option of regional in-person gatherings at several local church locations (to be announced). Saturday's business sessions will be virtual only.

The **Friday afternoon and evening programs for the whole diocesan community** will feature a line-up of special guest speakers that includes the Rev. Lydia Kelsey Bucklin, Canon to the Ordinary for Discipleship and Vitality, Diocese of Northern Michigan, giving a plenary presentation; Bishop Douglas J. Fisher of the Diocese of Western Massachusetts preaching at the Convention Eucharist; and Dr. Catherine Meeks, Executive Director of the Absalom Jones Center for Racial Healing, giving a keynote address.

Registration will open online in August. Preliminary information was e-mailed to clergy and delegates on June 24, and is also available at www.diomass.org/diocesan-convention-2021.

Questions about **delegate certification** and any changes of clergy or delegate contact information should be directed to Chelsea Smith at csmith@diomass.org as soon as possible so that important convention information reaches those who need it.

The **submission deadline** for all proposed resolutions, nominations for positions to be filled by election and required reports is *Friday, Sept. 10 by 5 p.m.* Find more information about open positions to be filled by election <u>here</u> and the nomination form <u>here</u>. The online resolutions submission form will open in July.

The modified **resolutions process** used last year will again provide online opportunities for discussing and refining proposed resolutions prior to the convention, with an open comment period *Sept. 20-27* and two Zoom meetings for discussion of resolutions, on *Tuesday, Sept. 21* and *Wednesday, Sept. 22, from 7 to 8:30 p.m.*

In addition, the regular series of **pre-convention forums** for clergy and delegates will be held online via Zoom in October for learning and discussion about the issues and business to come before the convention. Forums will be held from 7 to 8:30 p.m. on:

- Monday, Oct. 18 (Central Region);
- Tuesday, Oct. 19 (Northern and Western Region); and
- Thursday, Oct. 28 (Southern Region). A daytime forum will also be held on Friday, Oct. 29, 2-3:30 p.m.

Oct. 12 Clergy Day to focus on "The Church Cracked Open"

The annual Clergy Day will be held on *Tuesday, Oct. 12, 4-8 p.m.* This year's keynote speaker, the Rev. Stephanie Spellers, Canon to the Presiding Bishop for Evangelism, Reconciliation and Stewardship of Creation, will speak about her latest book, *The Church Cracked Open: Disruption, Decline and New Hope for Beloved Community*, and reflect on the COVID-19 pandemic, racial reckoning and the immense transformations taking place within the church. The planning committee currently anticipates opportunities for clergy to participate in-person as well as virtually. • Online safe church training transitioning to new platform:

The online abuse prevention training made available by the Church Pension Group and Praesidium is upgrading to a new system. "Safeguarding Online" Praesidium's Armatus Learn to Protect System is becoming Praesidium Academy on July 14. Active users, including parish administrators, should keep an eye out for an e-mail from Praesidium Academy on the launch day inviting them to log in using the e-mail address associated with their account and to update their password in order to access the training. There will be no expiration on the link sent out to administrators and learners.

Please note that as of July 12 at 6 p.m., learners will no longer be able to take courses in Armatus. Armatus administrators will have "view only" access until Dec. 31 if they need to access learner course completions prior to Jan. 1, 2017; learner records that are in an active status and completed a course starting Jan. 1, 2017, or later will be migrated over to the new Praesidium Academy.

- Music for the Ministry of the Steps: Come sing on the steps of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston, as part of its Ministry of the Steps this summer: *Thursday, July 8* and *Thursday, Aug. 12, 11 a.m.-1 p.m.* Those who come will sing for one another and the busy crowds on Boston Common. From September to May, the diocesan Congregational Consultants sponsored and conducted hour-long seminars on eight key topics: Clergy compensation, year-end matters, annual meetings, vestry roles and responsibilities, Parochial Reports I (financial information) and Parochial Reports II (non-financial information), audits, and investments. FORMATION Opportunities:

• The Diocese of Massachusetts has purchased a **Vibrant Faith season pass for summer/fall MasterClasses**, making a limited number of spaces for each class available at no cost. A Vibrant Faith MasterClass is a focused look at one aspect of lifelong faith formation, presented by an expert teacher, that incorporates both the "why?" and "how?" of the subject. Each class consists of two 90-minute sessions with live, interactive presentations; following the second session, each instructor holds an office hour for additional (and specific) questions and dialogue. The first three being offered this summer are "Guiding People into their Calling"; "Skills for Coaching Ministry Leaders"; and "Intergenerational Worship for All Ages."

The diocese also has a **ChurchNext formation school**, enabling participation at no cost in more than 400 available classes offered by ChurchNext. More than half of the courses are designed for group settings (and can work easily on Zoom), and discussion questions are provided. • Mission Strategy "Wicked Good Idea" Microgrants: The Mission Strategy Committee of Diocesan Council is receiving applications for "Wicked Good Idea" microgrants to help congregations, networks or diocesan organizations try out a great idea that's meant to further our shared mission strategy.
