Convention resolutions, nominations, reports due Sept. 10

Start planning & stay tuned for Season of Creation, Sept. 1-Oct. 4 Diocesan Convention takes place *Friday-Saturday, Nov. 12-13*, under the theme "Members One of Another" taken from Romans 12:5 and an invitation to celebrate and explore our interdependence as members of the Body of Christ.

Sessions on Friday afternoon and evening, with a line-up of special guest speakers, will be virtual and open to all, with the option to participate via in-person gatherings at several host church locations to be announced (and pending COVID metrics). Saturday's business sessions will be virtual only.

Clergy and delegates should watch for an e-mail later this month with registration and additional information.

The **submission deadline** for all proposed resolutions, nominations for positions to be filled by election and required reports is *Friday, Sept. 10 by 5 p.m.* Find open positions to be filled by election <u>here</u> and the nomination form <u>here</u>. The online resolutions submission form is now open <u>here</u>, and resolution-writing guidelines are available <u>here</u>.

The modified **resolutions process** used last year will again provide online opportunities for discussing and refining proposed resolutions prior to the convention, with an open comment period *Sept. 20-27* and two Zoom meetings for discussion of resolutions, on *Tuesday, Sept. 21* and *Wednesday, Sept. 22, from 7 to 8:30 p.m.*

In addition, the regular series of **pre-convention forums** for clergy and delegates will be held online via Zoom in October for learning and discussion about the issues and business to come before the convention. Forums will be held from 7 to 8:30 p.m. on:

- Monday, Oct. 18 (Central Region);
- Tuesday, Oct. 19 (Northern and Western Region); and

• Thursday, Oct. 28 (Southern Region). A daytime forum will also be held on Friday, Oct. 29, 2-3:30 p.m.

Sept. 1-Oct. 4, designated as Season of Creation, is an opportunity to focus worship, prayer, educational events and actions on God's extraordinary creation and the climate crisis threatening all life on our planet. The diocesan Creation Care Justice Network will be offering resources for congregations and clergy for the season and its theme, "Hope Beyond the Heat," to be posted at <u>www.diomass.org/</u> <u>creation-care</u> in mid-August. Additionally, there will be a preaching workshop on *Sept. 16* and an online retreat, open to all, on *Oct. 2* (see page 3). All are invited to start planning and stay tuned.

Oct. 12 Clergy Day to focus on "The Church Cracked Open"

"Cracked Open? Now What?" online conversation session for the laity: Oct. 12 at noon

NOTES:

The **annual diocesan Clergy Day** will be held on *Tuesday, Oct. 12, 4-8 p.m.* Online registration opens on Aug. 17. Keynote speaker the Rev. Canon Stephanie Spellers will draw from her new book, *The Church Cracked Open: Disruption, Decline and New Hope for Beloved Community,* and from churchwide efforts toward truth-telling and discipleship, in order to help equip the gathering as a community of leaders and learners whose churches and communities have been "cracked open" by pandemic, racial reckoning, economic suffering and generations-long decline. This year's Clergy Day includes opportunities for clergy to be together in person as well as to participate virtually. The Cathedral Church of St. Paul (138 Tremont Street) in Boston will be the main site; proceedings will be broadcast to two additional satellite sites where clergy may gather in person to participate in the event and for fellowship together. The fee to attend an in-person gathering is \$20 per person and includes dinner. Clergy are invited to attend at the location of their choosing.

A livestream of the event will be available for those clergy who are not able to join in person at one of the three locations. There is no fee to attend virtually, and once registered as such, participants will receive information prior to the event about how to access the livestream online.
