Bishop Harris announces upcoming retirement

Bishop Suffragan Gayle E. Harris has announced her upcoming retirement. After nearly 20 years of service, she plans to complete her work in the diocese as of Dec. 31 and then take sabbatical time ahead of her official retirement date of March 31, 2023.

At her request, in lieu of a diocesanwide gathering to celebrate her ministry, leave-taking events will be scheduled with groups with which she has worked closely. There will also be a time of recognition at Diocesan Convention on Oct. 29.

Bishop Alan M. Gates will not be calling for the election of a successor bishop suffragan, opting instead to appoint an assistant bishop. Following the process required by the canons of The Episcopal Church, the diocesan Standing Committee has given its consent for him to ask the Diocesan Convention to approve the creation of the assistant bishop position and authorize him to make the appointment.

NEWS & EVENT NOTES:

- The **Annual Enrollment** period for eligible employees is from *Oct. 12 to Nov. 2*. This is the period **when eligible employees can make changes to their enrollment in medical and dental insurance** without a qualifying event. The same plan offerings will be available in 2023 as in 2022. While this means that enrolled employees do not need to take any action to keep their current enrollment, the Church Pension Group (CPG) recommends that each employee log in to the system to verify their information.
- CPG will be sending out e-mails to all enrolled members with information on how to confirm their choices for next year.
- The Explanations of Benefits & Coverage for the medical and dental plans are available on <u>CPG's website</u>.
- The diocese's policies for congregations to provide health insurance to employees can be found in the <u>Compensation and Benefits Guidelines</u>.
- Employees who are eligible but not currently enrolled should contact Nathaniel Fasman at nfasman@diomass.org if they would like to enroll in insurance for 2023. Contact him also to request a copy of the new rates for 2023.

DIOCESAN COUNCIL ACTIONS:

At its Aug. 11 meeting, the Diocesan Council:

Moved into an executive session to discuss financial reports and the proposed 2023 diocesan budget.

Voted with one abstention to approve the Mission Initiatives Committee recommendations for the 2022 funding allocations to new mission initiatives as submitted.

Voted with one abstention to designate the proceeds of the sale of the property of the closed Church of the Good Shepherd in Fairhaven for the establishment of a \$100,000 seed fund for property development, subject to continued reporting to the Diocesan Council, and for support of the position of missioner for property stewardship.

Voted to approve the housing allowance of a clergy diocesan staff member.

Voted to approve signing authorization for diocesan financial accounts to Debra Thomas, effective on Sept. 1 or the start date of her position as chief financial officer.

Voted to approve the assessment adjustment of \$10,000 for the Church of the Advent in Medfield.

At its Sept. 17 retreat, the Diocean Council:

Voted to approve the proposed budget of revenue and expenses for 2023, including individual parish and mission assessments and approved adjustments for 2023, to be presented to the Diocesan Convention for its consideration and action.
