## Implementing Diocesan **Convention resolutions:**

Support & engage with the Poor People's Campaign: March 21 preaching and dinner with the Rev. Dr. Liz Theoharis

Publicity materials are available to help spread the word in congregations about Presiding Bishop Michael B. Curry's planned visit to Boston in April to celebrate Old North Church's 300th anniversary and to spend time with youth and young adults in the diocese. Curry will preach and speak at two celebratory services at Old North on Sunday, April 16: 11 a.m. Festival Choral Eucharist and a 6 p.m. Lantern Service that promises to be an inspirational evening of song and rededication, culminating in the lighting of Old North's steeple lanterns. While in Boston for the Old North celebration, Curry also will be participating in two free events on Saturday, April 15, one open to all diocesan middle and high school youth and their adult mentors, from 9 to 11 a.m. at St. Cyprian's Church in Roxbury; and another for young adults (over 18) in the diocese, from 2 to 4 p.m. at Boston University. An ambitious goal has been set to raise \$300,000 for 2023 through the renewed Bishops' Annual Appeal in support of shared mission as a diocesan community committed to being disciples of Jesus, seekers of justice and protectors of creation.

The bishops have asked clergy and wardens to promote the Bishops' Annual Appeal locally, by announcing it and distributing materials directly to their congregations, and designating March 19 (or another date) as an "Ingathering Sunday" during Lent.

The 2022 Diocesan Convention called on the diocesan Racial Justice Commission and the Indigenous Peoples' Justice Network of the Dioceses of Massachusetts and Western Massachusetts, together with the Indigenous Peoples' Justice Network of Province I, to support this diocese in the implementation of the resolution "Fostering Right Relationship: Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts, Indigenous Episcopalians and Our Indigenous Neighbors."

To that end, the commission and networks are seeking individuals to **join one of four working groups that are being organized**: Land Acknowledgement Recommendations, co-chaired by Charlotte Hand Greeson and Margaret Lias; Education and Formation, chaired by Michael Scuderi; Relationships and Allyship, chaired by the Rev.
