## Upcoming online series explores new models of evangelism

St. Peter's Church in Dartmouth is striving to redefine the Christian experience for the contemporary world with a collaboration between the Episcopal Campus Ministry at UMass-Dartmouth and the parish counseling center, The Bridge: A Center for Hope and Healing. #### • Small Church as a Laboratory for Experimentation,

Wednesday, March 26, 5:30-6:30 p.m.:

The Church of Our Saviour in Arlington is small, with a sanctuary that seats fewer than a hundred people. But they've discovered that their small size enables them to experiment and offer customtailored ministry in ways that would be difficult if they were large. Come and hear about how they began a Eucharist service tailored to the needs of toddlers and their families, which has now grown into a youth group that can support tweens and teens with different needs and gifts. 	• The annual <b>Parochial Report</b> has been modified extensively, and clergy and lay leaders may want guidance before the March 1 filing deadline. To that end, a series of sessions offered by the diocesan Congregational Consultants is underway. The second of two Zoom sessions on how to fill out the <b>finan-cial portion</b> of the Parochial Report, presented by diocesan CFO Debra Thomas and consultant Terry Robinson, will be held on <i>Saturday, Feb. 8 at 9 a.m.</i> (register here). The <b>non-financial portions</b> of the Parochial Report will be presented by Debra Thomas and consultant the Rev. Cynthia Hubbard in a one-hour Zoom call on <i>Thursday, Feb. 13 at 9 a.m.</i> (register here) and again on <i>Saturday, Feb. 15 at 9 a.m.</i> (register here). • Leadership Reports due by March 1: The Leadership Report and Lay Delegate Certification Form are distributed annually to collect updated church and lay leadership contact information. Congregations are asked to submit the Congregational Leadership Report within 10 days of their annual meeting as required by diocesan canons (Canon 2.2) and no later than Saturday, March 1.

The information provided through this process is critical to make sure that important diocesan information reaches congregations' current leaders in the upcoming year. Diocesan communications lists will reflect the information updates from this report.

• Assessment statements and electronic assessment pay-

**ments:** In late January, congregations should have received their 2025 assessment invoice in the mail, along with a statement(s) of outstanding prior year balances (if applicable). If the invoice was not received, contact Amal Armanyous in the diocesan Treasurer's Office at <u>aarmanyous@diomass.org</u>.

Congregations can now sign up to make their assessment payments electronically. This will reduce delays associated with sending payments by check through the mail. The diocesan Treasurer's Office is asking all congregations to sign up to make electronic payments by completing the encrypted online form available <u>here</u>. Those who are interested in also receiving diocesan payments electronically (such as grant payments) can check a box on the form to indicate that preference.

• Electronic submission of annual financial audits: Diocesan audit submission procedures have been updated, and only electronic copies of congregations' annual financial audits are now being accepted. Audit packages should be e-mailed to <u>audits@</u> diomass.org. The package should include the auditor's report, findings and recommendations, completed audit checklist, the fiscal year balance sheet and income and expense statement, along with the written response from the vestry to the audit comments and recommendations. Audits are due on *Sept. 1*. It is recommended that congregations schedule their audit now so that it can be completed on time.

• Registration is now open for all sessions of the **2025 Clergy Professional Development Day**, offered in two parts, with each part held four times. **Part I is a workshop from Braver Angels** on how to understand the values and concerns of those who differ politically, consistent with the call to be ambassadors of reconciliation (2 Cor. 5:19-20). The goal is build bridges across divides and share beliefs in ways that support community and promote transformation. **All clergy are encouraged to take advantage of this workshop.** 

For clergy who are due (or overdue) to refresh Safe Church requirements in 2025, **Part II is a Safe Church Review** which fulfills the refresher requirement, along with attendance at a Part I workshop and assigned online training. Clergy may choose to attend the segments in any order and in any combination.

Clergy for whom Part II is also a requirement have been notified individually via e-mail of their status. Those unsure if they are due for Safe Church Training renewal this year may contact Jennifer Garrett (jgarrett@diomass.org).

Some clergy may have attended one or both of the Professional Development Day segments in a past year without completing the other steps to renew requirements and are now not considered clergy in good standing with the Diocese of Massachusetts. Partially completed requirements from a previous year are not transferrable; all requirements are to be completed within the same calendar year for renewal. Those who are due for renewal in 2025, or were due in a prior year but did not complete all requirements in that year, should attend both the workshop and the review segment as well as complete other requirements. The program challenges congregations to try new programs and prayerfully reflect on current and proposed programs that nurture and reimagine congregational life.</li> <li>The 2025 guidelines are available here. Letters of intent are due by March 15 via this online form, with completed applications (here) due by May 3.</li> <li>The diocesan committee entrusted with the stewardship of these funds seeks to ensure that recipients have followed through with the plans that served as the basis for receiving a grant; 2024 recipients are asked to complete, by March 14, the grant report form found here.
