1. There are two primary newsletters that clergy should receive:

• **FYI** is issued via e-mail the first Wednesday of the month and carries diocesan news and information for clergy and leadership. The distribution list is generated from our clergy/ lay leadership database according to roles; once a new clergyperson is recorded in the database, they should receive the FYI automatically. • **E-News** is sent out by e-mail on the third Wednesday of the month to the wider diocesan community and carries general interest news of the diocese and its congregations and people, as well as event information. Marriage Officiant Registration and Remarriage Application:

To register to perform marriages in Massachusetts please visit: <u>https://www.sec.state.ma.us/pre/prepdf/Massachusetts Resident Clergy Form.pdf</u> You will only have to do this upon arrival in a parish. In January of each year the Office of the Bishop takes care of renewal for all settled parish clergy.

If you are asked to officiate at the marriage of a divorced person, please follow the remarriage rules of our diocese outlined here:

All clergy applying for permission to officiate at a remarriage in the Diocese of Massachusetts should note the following policies:

- Six months must elapse after date a final decree of divorce by the state or civil authority becomes effective, before a potential remarriage can be solemnized.
- Fully completed applications for remarriage, with the required documentation, must be received in Bishop Gallagher's office, or in Bishop Gates's office in the case of clergy remarriage, 45 days prior to the date of the proposed marriage.

For Clergy Canonically Resident or Licensed in the Diocese of Massachusetts:

- The canons of this church require that a priest receive permission to officiate from the diocesan bishop where he or she is canonically resident or licensed before solemnizing the remarriage of a divorced person.
- Bishop Alan M. Gates has asked Bishop Carol J. Gallagher to act on his behalf in these matters by receiving and reviewing from resident and licensed priests all requests for permission to solemnize the remarriage of divorced lay persons.
- This permission is not required if a spouse from the previous marriage is deceased; if any spouse of a previous marriage is living, permission is required.
- Requests for the remarriage of clergy members should be sent directly to Bishop Gates.

3. Clergy Colleague Support: If you would like assistance finding a clergy support group, please be in touch with your regional canon. 4. Financial Assistance:

If you find yourself in a financial situation that could be helped by some targeted support please speak to your dean or regional canon who can consult with our bishops about possible assistance. Depending upon the focus of your need, resources may include the Employee Assistance Program (EAP) provided through The Medical Trust; special funds for continuing education, sabbaticals, and clergy children's scholarships; or emergency assistance from the Bishop's Discretionary Funds for urgent need such as rent, mortgage, or uninsured medical costs.

Professional Expectations for Clergy:

Canonically resident clergy are required by canon to attend the annual Diocesan Convention. Attendance at the annual Clergy Conference, fall Clergy Day, and other specially announced trainings are expected of full-time clergy, and strongly encouraged for part-time and bivocational clergy. In all cases clergy should signal and explain any absence from these professional gatherings by sending a note in advance to the bishop.

- Clergy are expected to make full use of the Continuing Education provisions in their Covenant of Ministry letters, using the allocated time off and allowance on an annual basis.
